Chickenpox

We are currently experiencing an outbreak of chickenpox at the school. Information can be found on the Kids Health website

https://www.kidshealth.org.nz/chickenpox, including the following key points:

- chickenpox is a common childhood illness caused by a virus
- it is very easy to catch
- most cases of chickenpox are mild and children get better completely
- your child needs to see a doctor if they have a very high fever or are very ill, particularly if they become very drowsy, or are breathing fast or vomiting a lot
- children with chickenpox need to stay home from school and daycare
- chickenpox can sometimes cause serious complications
- children can now have free chickenpox immunisation

PLASTIC FREE JULY

It's PLASTIC FREE JULY and the Environment team are supporting the school with a fundraiser from EarthMama.nz and encouraging you all to think about how we can make a difference/change habits around plastic usage.

Over the holidays have a good look at the EarthMama website, and think about some pledges you and your families might make. For instance

- 1. Only use re-useable shopping bags from now on
- 2. Stop using plastic straws
- 3. Keep cups for coffee and re-usable drink bottles for water
- 4. Replace cling film with food wraps or food covers

To help the kids understand the impact of plastic take a trip to the beach, tidy up any plastic rubbish, bring it home and keep it in a bin to observe what happens and how it weathers, do some searching on plastic impacts (e.g. The Story of Stuff has some great short videos) or watch Blue Planet by David Attenborough.



- 1. It takes 450 years for plastic to break down
- 2. If we carry on using and discarding plastic at our current rate by 2050 there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish
- 3. When plastic breaks down it only breaks up into tinier and tinier particles, which the fish eat and then ultimately we may eat as part of the food chain ugh!
