# Information for Whānau COVID-19 Update

At this stage, we are not expecting widespread school closures in New Zealand. Any decisions about school closures will be made on a case by case basis by the Ministries of Education and Health.

In the meantime, unless students are unwell themselves, then parents should keep sending them to schools and early learning centres as these environments continue to be safe and the best place for them to continue their learning.

It is also important to continue to focus on encouraging good hygiene practices as a preventative to the spread of illness. These include:

- Washing hands with soap and water before and after eating as well as after using the toilet - please see this useful link to <u>Nanogirl</u> using science to show children why handwashing is so important.
- Covering coughs and sneezes with clean tissues or with an elbow (see below for our standard request for each child to bring a box of tissues to school).
- Putting used tissues in the bin.
- Encouraging staff and students to stay home if they are unwell.

#### Talking to Children and Young People About COVID-19

Given the rise in the number of reported cases, there may be children or young people in your life who experience distress. As a trusted adult, you can help reassure and educate them about COVID-19 – it can be good to talk to them now, so they can understand the illness and be reassured.

Although we have no immediate plans for school closure (and we know children function best when their routines are secure) things are changing rapidly and we intend to be prepared if we are required to close at short notice.
