Beat the Bugs this Winter

There has been lots of information about the continued risk of rising COVID-19 cases as we head into winter. At Good Shepherd School we continue to have some cases of students and teachers testing positive.

Thank you for your cooperation in not spending too much time in classrooms and in continuing to wear masks while visiting the school. We have also had high compliance with our request for students, especially those in Years 4-6, to wear masks while indoors.

Our other mitigation measures include:

- good cough and sneeze etiquette
- regular cleaning
- staying away if unwell
- good ventilation in all indoor areas

We are also aware of the dangers of the spread of measles, a highly infectious virus that spreads faster than COVID-19 in people who aren't immune to it. The best protection against measles is vaccination with two doses of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine. Please check with your doctor if you are unsure about your own or your children's vaccination status.

Good Shepherd OSCA

Good Shepherd School Uniform

Please ensure that your child is wearing their correct school uniform:

Winter Uniform: Students wear winter uniform in Terms 2 & 3. This includes black knee high socks and black shoes.

Sports Uniform: Compulsory for Years 4, 5 and 6. Jewellery, nail polish, makeup, hair

A watch and ear studs are the only jewellery permitted with the school uniform. Nail polish is not permitted on either fingers or toes. Makeup may not be worn. Long hair must be tied back. Hair accessories must be either navy blue or black.

Finally, we have a good selection of second hand uniforms available at minimal cost from our school office.
