From the Principal

Last year we had a comprehensive survey of our school community about the strategic direction of Good Shepherd School. This resulted in four strategic goals, one of which is a focus on Wellbeing: Our students develop habits and skills to support their physical, emotional, spiritual and mental wellbeing. This fits in well with the actions we have taken over the last few years to build resilience and Growth Mindset in our tamariki and, of course, is very timely as we work together to minimise the impact of the pandemic on our children. A key action we have taken to achieve this goal is to adopt the Mitey school wide approach to teaching mental health education. Part of sustaining all of our wellbeing is to take time out over the next two weeks to relax with your children and allow them (and yourselves) a break from the school day routine. We hope that part of this time out will be with some good reading material - it's such a gift for any person to be taken into another time and place through reading. reappearance of the Matariki stars in the early morning sky brings the past year to a close and marks the beginning of the new year. Matariki is about reconnecting with your home and whānau (family). At the Garden Club this week we made bath salts using dried herbs and flowers from the garden.



Attendance Dues and Donations 2023

Attendance Dues are a compulsory payment approved by the Minister of Education under the terms of the Education and Training Act 2020. They are a condition of enrolment at Good Shepherd School, as they are in all Catholic schools in

Aotearoa New Zealand. Attendance Dues are collected by Good Shepherd School on behalf of the school's Proprietor, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Auckland. Thank you to all of our families that have made payments already and to our families who have made per term, per week and per fortnight arrangements.

Good Shepherd School also asks for **donations** from whānau. We rely on these donations to provide the extra learning opportunities, such as the *Opera in Schools* performance last term, and the exceptional resources available to our students, such as one-to-one devices in our classrooms. These donations include *Trips and Activities* and, where relevant, camp donations so that we can offer our students a range of rich education outside the classroom experiences. As a small school, we very much appreciate these contributions to our limited budget.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE DUES FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Dropping off and Picking up Children

This is just a reminder that children are under the care of their parents or caregivers after 3pm, unless they



have been booked into our Out of School Care programme. They are, of course, supervised on the Church steps until approximately 3.15pm, by which time parents will have picked them up. Similarly, we have Out of School care between 7.30am and 8.30am for those children whose parents need to get away to work early. Children are not closely supervised in the playground before 8.30am.

Good Shepherd School Uniform

The children should now be wearing their winter school uniforms. Uniforms are purchased through Elizabeth Michael Uniforms although we do keep a supply of second hand uniforms for purchase at the school. Online orders can be made through Elizabeth Michael's website with the code GS132. Can we please give special attention to footwear over the winter months? The uniform shoes are black, worn with black knee high socks. We encourage students to bring in and wear sports shoes for sports but they must wear their uniform shoes to and from school.

In this colder weather we strongly recommend that children wear the school uniform jumper and there is also a school jacket available. A warm singlet could also be useful. Please name all uniform items.

Finally, children are asked to bring in a change of clothes if they want to play on the field as it quickly becomes very muddy.

Health Message from Te Whatu Ora - Health New Zealand

This winter, between Monday 12 June and Saturday 30 September, participating community pharmacies in Auckland will provide a Minor Health Conditions Service for Māori and Pacific people, children aged under 14 years, and community service card holders.

The service allows pharmacists to have a clinical consultation and provide advice as well as medication if needed for a select set of minor health conditions at no cost to the patient.

It also includes whānau members of a child with similar symptoms. For example, if the pharmacist determines your child needs treatment for scabies and they have older brothers or sisters, or you yourself also have symptoms, they may provide advice and medication for all of you.

The following health conditions are included in the Minor Health Conditions Service:

- Acute diarrhoea
- Dehydration
- Eye inflammation and infections
- Scabies
- Headlice
- Pain and fever
- Eczema/Dermatitis
- Minor skin infections

If your condition needs further support, the pharmacist can tell you the best place to go to get further help.

Let's spread the word to our friends and whānau about this new service! It's also important to remember that you can always speak to your local pharmacist for free health advice, even if you are not eligible for this service.

Winter health and vaccination reminders

Te Whatu Ora encourages whānau to vaccinate their tamariki for pneumococcal disease, Meningococcal B, measles, and flu, alongside their three COVID-19 vaccines to provide the greatest level of protection heading into winter.
