To achieve this goal we planned to focus on:

- students taking responsibility for their learning, especially in the area of writing
- developing the ability in all our children to speak Te Reo Māori, the language of Aotearoa New Zealand
- developing the use of digital technologies to support and deepen learning
- further developing our physical environment to support effective independent learning.

It is my pleasure to update you on our progress:

- Teachers have once again worked closely with our external facilitator, Murray Gadd, on effective writing programmes and motivating children to write.
- Good Shepherd School will be working closely with seven Catholic primary schools and four Catholic colleges as part of the Central Catholic Community of Learning in 2017 and beyond.
- A programme of Te Reo Māori is delivered throughout the school and our Kapa Haka group will be performing at the Albert/Eden Cultural Festival in November.
- Teachers continue to participate in professional development in the area of deepening learning through the use of digital technologies.
- With the support of the PTA we are looking at how to best use our classroom space and furniture to promote independent learning.

We are looking forward to making further progress to achieving our strategic objectives in this and other areas in term 4. Meanwhile, we wish you and your children a well-earned break over the next two weeks. Enjoy your time together!

#### **Seventh-Day Adventist School Performance**


On Wednesday the 14th September, Good Shepherd walked to the Seventh-Day Adventist School to see a performance of "Noah and the Ark".


What an amazing term it has been!


