Community Involvement



This is not a disadvantage for your child as they will be working with someone who knows them well, nor is it an indication that they have not done well in 2023. Class placements for 2024 are final. We appreciate the trust you show in our professional judgement by not requesting particular placements (or attempting to change placements) for your children. We are of course, very open to discussing student wellbeing within their class, but we do request that you allow your child at least three weeks at the beginning of 2024 to settle in first.

Summer Reading

Many children, especially struggling readers, forget some of what they have learned or slip out of practice during the summer holidays.

It's hard to keep up a reading routine in a season packed with distractions and diversions.

Try these three steps to help your child improve their reading during the summer and beyond. They will fit into a busy schedule and make reading fun!

- **1. Six books to summer success:** Research shows that reading just six books during the summer may keep a struggling reader from going backwards. When choosing the six, be sure that they are just right not too hard and not too easy. Visit your local library. Ask for help selecting books that match your child's age, interests, and abilities.
- **2. Read something every day:** Encourage your child to take every opportunity to read. Morning: the newspaper even if it's just the comics

or today's weather


Daytime: schedules, recipes, TV guides, magazines, online resources, etc.

Evening: End the day by having your child read to you from the book he or she is currently reading. Have them rehearse a paragraph, page, or chapter before reading to you. Rereading will help them be more fluent – able to read at an appropriate speed, correctly, and with good expression

3. Keep reading aloud: Reading aloud benefits all children and teens, especially those who struggle. One benefit is that you can read books your child can't, so they will build listening comprehension skills. This will increase their knowledge and expand their experience with text, so that they will do better when reading on their own.

Summer Uniform in Term 4 and term 1 2024. ALL children are expected to be in their full summer uniform.

Summer Uniform: Students wear summer uniforms in Terms 4 & 1. This includes black sandals and a wide-brim hat. **NO BASEBALL CAPS!**

If a child does not bring their hat to school they must stay in the shade during morning tea and lunchtime breaks.

Uniforms are purchased through Elizabeth Michael Uniforms although we do keep a supply of second hand uniforms for purchase at the school for \$5 per item. Online orders can be made through Elizabeth Michael's website with the code GS132.

Finally, children are asked to bring in a change of clothes if they want to play on the field as it quickly becomes very muddy.
