
the Shine Organisation to help the charity make a difference.

Thursday 16th February is World Read Aloud Day.



The library will be marking this occasion at lunchtime on Thursday and Friday with books, activities and spaces available for the children to read aloud. World Read Aloud Day is all about spreading a love for reading. It provides a chance for people worldwide to share stories and promote the right to literacy for everyone - that everyone in the world should get to read and write.

Reading aloud to children every day puts them almost a year ahead of children who do not receive daily read alouds regardless of parental income, education level or cultural background. (Melbourne Institute of Applied Economic and Social Research)

Reading aloud to children and babies is repeatedly affirmed as "the single most important activity" to promote independent reading success.
