#### From the principal....

Greetings to you all!

At the PTA meeting this week I reported to those present about two important developments in education that have impacted on Good Shepherd School recently - the teachers' strike on 15 August and the Auckland Central Catholic Kāhui Ako (Community of Learning). Thank you for your support during the strike last week - we know it was inconvenient for you to make provision for your children but your messages of support show that you understand the crisis facing our schools in terms of teacher supply at the moment.

As you know, I have been appointed to the dual leadership role of our Catholic community of learning, involving eight primary and four secondary Catholic schools situated in the central Auckland area. This is a very powerful opportunity for us to work together for the benefit of all our students and I am very much looking forward to building on the good work that has been done over the last two years.

The PTA is often looked on as a fundraising group but it is, in fact, far more than that. It is an important vehicle for building a strong Good Shepherd community, providing friendship and fun and a way of getting to know each other better. PTA meetings also give us an opportunity to talk about school happenings in an informal way and are, therefore, a valuable means of communication between home and school. There is plenty of research that shows that the more parents are involved in their children's education, the better their children perform at school, and belonging to the PTA is a great way to get involved.

#### **Enrolments at Good Shepherd School**

Thank you to all those families who have filled out enrolment forms for siblings of current students. This is also a gentle reminder to do so, if you haven't already done this. We also appreciate the support of our school families in recommending Good Shepherd School to their friends and whānau.

#### **Before and After School Safety Procedures**

Good Shepherd has procedures in place to ensure that our students travel to and from school safely and we ask our parents to abide by these procedures for the safety of all children.

- The chain at the Telford Avenue entrance is up from 8.00 - 9.00am and 2.30 - 3.30pm. This means that no cars may drive into this area to drop off or pick up children during these times.
- All children must wait on the Church steps to be picked up after school where they are supervised by a staff member. There is no supervision at the Volcanic Street entrance and children are under the care of their parents or caregivers once they move to this area.
- The chains at both the Telford Ave and the Volcanic St entrances are up over the lunch break from 1.00
   1.50pm as children are moving through the car park areas during this time.
- We have four wonderful Walking School Buses to support our children walking to school safely. Visit our school website for more information.

#### Absence from school during term time

At this time of year we have a number of families taking children out of school during term time for holidays/family times overseas. Please note the following guidelines around these absences:

- Good Shepherd School strongly encourages students to be at school every day possible
- The Ministry of Education considers holidays during term time an unjustifiable absence and requires schools to record them as such
- While holidays overseas may provide valuable learning experiences, they can cause gaps in students' learning that are not easily detected or filled
- If you are considering taking your child out of school during term time, notification needs to be sent in writing to the principal
- Extended absences during term time add to teachers' workload as they try to make up lost learning time in core subject areas
- Teachers are not able to provide individualised learning programmes for students who are absent during term time on overseas holidays
