

#### **Netsafe Tips for Parents**

Online safety for parents is more important than ever. As young people begin to spend more time online, it's important that parents start to teach them how to stay safe. So, how do you get started?

#### SET EXPECTATIONS

Talk to your child about the type of behaviours you'd like them to adopt. For example, how long they should spend online, what apps and social media sites you'd like them to use and what is appropriate content to view. This will be different depending on the age of your child, and what you feel comfortable with. Technological options like parental controls can help, but it needs to be teamed with online safety education.

#### UNDERSTAND WHAT THEY DO ONLINE

Talk to your child about what they're using the internet for.

- What's involved?
- Who's in their network?
- What information do they share?
- Are they using the internet
  - to learn?
  - to communicate and create friendships with others?
  - to create music or videos?

Really listen to what they have to say – what might seem like 'just a game' to you, could in fact be a way for them to connect with people who have similar interests.

Showing an interest in the things they do helps to build your understanding of what their online world looks like and creates an environment that makes it easier to have more difficult conversations about in the future.

#### **Fortnite Online Game**

We have noticed a number of children making reference to this game in their play at school. Because this is an R12 game, we presume this could be because they see their older siblings playing the game at home. We are, however, concerned about some of the content of the game and have asked that children do not use this content in their play at school.

#### **School Uniform**

Students will change to wearing the summer uniform from the start of Term 4, 2018 and through to the end of Term 1, 2019. Summer uniform also includes a sunhat which must be worn for outdoor play.


