

If you have the downloaded the app from last year and your child has changed classes, you will need to change the class you want to receive notifications from. Go to the drop down menu icon, located in the top left corner, select Alert Subscriptions, Classrooms, and then Select the classroom/s.

Netscape Tips for Parents Set expectations

Talk to your child about the type of behaviours you'd like them to adopt.

- how long they should spend online (tips on timing)
- what apps and social media sites you'd like them to use
- what is appropriate content to view.

This will be different depending on the age of your child, and what you feel comfortable with. Technological options like <u>parental controls</u> can help, but it needs to be teamed with online safety education.
