From the principal....


Kia ora te whānau

We cannot ignore the tragedy that took place in Christchurch on 15 March, and its impact on every single one of us. At school our priority has been to support our children, staff and families in whatever way they need to make sense of this event. We followed the advice of the Ministry of Education, which was to acknowledge the event in an age appropriate way, to encourage the children to talk to an adult if they are worried, and to emphasise the good actions that have followed. Our School Council initiated a mufti day on Friday, with the proceeds donated to those most affected by the tragedy, and they also wrote to two Christchurch Catholic schools who would have been involved in the lockdown. We finished the week with the whole school joining hands at 1.40pm in two minutes silence. We were very proud of the children who showed great love and respect for those hurt by this tragedy during this commemoration. I have attached to this newsletter a letter from Bishop Patrick Dunn, giving some advice from the New Zealand Police in the wake of this tragic event.

The consultation period for the Tomorrow's Schools review report is about to draw to a close, with online submissions finishing on 31 March and consultations closing on 7 April. If you have any thoughts at all on the recommendations of this review, I urge you to take advantage of this opportunity to give feedback on a document that has major implications on the direction of schooling in New Zealand.

Please do not hesitate to contact the school if you would like to discuss either of the above further. If you would like an informal catch up why don't you come along to the Parents' Morning Tea organised for 9am on Thursday 4 April? It's a great opportunity to talk about anything to do with your children's schooling.

Health and Safety over the next few weeks

Next week construction will begin on the new fitness trail (the focus for the fundraising for the last school fair). To ensure the safety of the children, staff and families, the school field will be split in two to exclude everyone except for the construction vehicles and contractors. This exclusion will be in place until after the completion of the project which is expected by the end of the term. In effect this will mean that Rooms 1, 2, 3 & 4, the library and the OSCA programme will use the side gate next to the swimming pool, and the administration area, Rooms 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 and the turf and playground will be accessed through the normal gate.

You will notice that the area next to the block wall, including the pathway to the Volcanic Street walkway, is now partially fenced off due to health and safety concerns. Please be safe around both these exclusion areas until the fencing comes down.

Teach them the basics

1. Strong passwords

A strong password helps protect the information in your online profiles or accounts. Teach your child how to choose strong passwords, by reading how to choose a good password.

2. Information to protect online

- Login details and passwords
- Bank account details
- Home address
- Phone numbers
- Birthdate
- Personal information that could be used to guess security questions for online accounts

You should also talk about personal details they could share online, such as where they are and the school they attend. This includes sharing their location – some apps allow you to share your current location with friends, or publicly.

3. Not everything is as it seems

It can seem like common knowledge to adults, but sometimes kids don't understand that people are not always who they say they are online. Talk to them about friending or communicating with people they don't know offline. For young children especially, they shouldn't friend someone online who they don't know personally offline.

4. Digital footprint

Teach your child that they need to think about what they post online, and that what they post online leaves a "digital footprint" about them. <u>Find out</u> <u>more about digital footprints</u>.
