Bullying Free New Zealand Week: Together we can prevent bullying in Aotearoa

Over the past few years New Zealand has acknowledged the ongoing problem we have with bullying in our country with 'Bullying Free New Zealand Week'. There have been a number of international comparative studies that have raised our awareness of this widespread problem in our schools. Both the *Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study* (TIMSS) 2014/15 and *Programme for International Student Assessment* (PISA) 2015 Wellbeing reports show rates of bullying in New Zealand schools are high compared with many other countries.

Good Shepherd School is committed to a whole-school approach to bullying prevention and to the creation of a safe and positive learning environment. We conduct a Wellbeing Survey twice a year with all students and our Bullying Prevention and Response Procedures are available on our school website. The key to building a learning environment where everyone is welcome, safe and free from bullying is working closely with our parents and whānau. Please encourage your children to talk to their teacher or other adult at school if they are experiencing a situation, or witnessing a situation, that they cannot resolve themselves.

On another note, I would like to commend our school leaders for the initiative they are showing this term in setting up activities for other children. We have handball, netball, R.E. art, writing, rippa/touch rugby (and other possibilities) all happening on different days for children to opt into, and all run by our senior students. This week I was present at the netball skills session and felt completely redundant as Lucy, Otis, Mia and Hannah ran stations of netball skills that would do any netball coach proud! Well done all of you!
