During this **Tongan Language Week / Uike 'O Lea Tonga** we thank our Tongan children and their families for sharing with us their expertise in this rich culture that plays such an important part in New Zealand society.

The week began on Sunday with the Pope's call for a World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation on the first day of our spring. He asks us all to start with a more sustainable personal and family lifestyle. Pope Francis wrote an encyclical (open letter) called Laudato Si' in 2015 calling on 'every person living on this planet' to make urgent changes to our lifestyles and how we consume energy in order to protect our 'common home'. This message is close to our hearts at Good Shepherd - not surprising for a community which has respect, care and honesty as its core values.

So far we have made huge progress in waste reduction and recycling, and we are working towards becoming a 'zero energy' school.
