

Room 3 & 4 Rugby World Cup

This term our inquiry focus is the Rugby World Cup and the countries that are competing in it. We chose some of the countries and in small groups we researched some interesting facts about them and presented them at assembly. Here are some photos of our groups:






















Here are some interesting facts about the rugby world cup:

- The same whistle is blown for the opening game of every Rugby World Cup tournament. It was first used in 1905 by a Welsh referee during a game between England and New Zealand.
- Biggest winning margin The Wallabies bet Namibia in 2003, on a scoreline of 142-0. New Zealand are the only team to score more points in a match, defeating Japan 145-17 in 1995.
- Before the first Rugby World Cup in 1987, the USA was technically the reigning international champion, because they had won the gold medal at the 1924 Summer Olympics rugby tournament.
- Marc Ellis boasts the most tries in one World Cup match, with six in New Zealand's 145-17 triumph over Japan in 1995.
- Captain Fantastic- New Zealand legend Richie McCaw is the only captain to win 2 Rugby World Cups in a row (2011 & 2015)
- 2007 is the only World Cup, where the All Blacks failed to reach the Semi-Finals.
- The World Cup winners are awarded the William Webb Ellis Cup William Webb Ellis was the Rugby School pupil who, according to popular myth, invented the game.

Learning Well

Every teacher at Good Shepherd School is committed to helping each child reach their absolute academic potential. So much goes on 'behind the scenes' to help us to achieve this, that we can hardly begin to describe it. It is a big part of what makes our work so challenging and so rewarding. We are faced with a continuous stream of research and resourcing related to learning, and keeping on top of this and working out what might be of most benefit to our students is consuming. Last term we trialled a revamped version of a trusted assessment tool (Progressive Achievement Test or PAT) to help gauge progress in reading for our Year 4-6 students. This online assessment gave us instant valuable information about individual students, to add to the picture we already have and to clarify our priorities for term 4. It was also interesting (and satisfying) to see where our students sit in relation to 'national norms' in reading, and this is shown in the graph below, with our students represented in red.
