Our students are aware of the impact of their actions on the environment and the role of sustainability in protecting it.

This is one of Good Shepherd's strategic goals, developed in consultation with the whole community and outlined in our school Charter. Supporting a Sustainable Future was chosen as the key theme for the Good Shepherd fair last year and environmental sustainability is getting a lot of attention in the school during these first few weeks. Our focus at the moment is to develop a detailed action plan for the year, aligned to our strategic plan and building on the work already done in this area. Michelle Taylor has taken over the role of leading the environmental sustainability work in school, and she will be working closely with other staff members, the student enviro team and key members of our school and parish communities to achieve our goals. We must acknowledge and thank Kezia Vergis for her leadership over the last few years in establishing our waste reduction

systems, encouraging children to travel to and from school in sustainable ways, and nurturing their interest in nature and the environment through the Garden Club. If you are interested in supporting us in this work please do not hesitate to contact me or Ms Taylor.

It has been a very busy beginning of the term, with children settling into their classrooms and working together with their teachers to build a positive and learning-focused culture in their classrooms (read about Room 7's *Valuable Values* in this newsletter for an example!).

Learning Well

Growth Mindset Success

Thank you to the whānau who completed our survey about our growth mindset focus last year. For those of you who have joined us recently, the term 'growth mindset' comes from the research of Carol Dweck. She says that learners with fixed mindsets believe they cannot increase their intelligence, so when learning becomes difficult, they may give up.

However, those with a growth mindset believe they can improve their intelligence through putting extra effort into learning when it gets difficult. Growth mindset is not an especially new concept, in fact it is closely linked to developing resilience and perseverance, both of which are central to learning at Good Shepherd School.

Whānau noticed positive change in their children last year. More than three quarters felt their child had a pretty good grasp of growth mindset, and noticed improvement in perseverance and resilience, as well as attitude towards new challenges and constructive criticism. ΔII participants want to see the focus continue into 2020 and teachers will certainly be making sure this happens. Read on for some comments about impact...

- X will always say "I don't know how to do that YFT"
- X is much improved in confidence to complete things she thinks are too hard. This has shown in her maths, where her confidence has grown a lot. We definitely still have things to work on but it's a massive difference.
- Working hard and resilience are critical to success in life. X likes to be naturally good at things and finds it hard to push through when she faces resistance, it would be great for her to develop that part of her personality more.
- There are too many adults who struggle with this so if we can encourage people as children to have a growth mindset they will carry that into adulthood.
- Having observed its use in the classroom it is something I wish was taught when I was younger.
