Last night at the PTA meeting, Jane Hahn presented some schoolwide findings from recent assessments in maths and reading. Teachers use these results for formative assessment, a process where they work out how to move each student forward in their learning. It is gratifying to see that as a group Good Shepherd students continue to perform well above

Information for Whānau Lunchbox reminder

We have a water only policy at Good Shepherd School. Children are welcome to bring their own water bottles to school but please ask them to leave juice and sugary drinks at home.



It is great to see children bringing fruit for a healthy brain break each morning but please be mindful of what else goes into your child's lunchbox each day. There is no doubt that children learn and concentrate better when they are eating mostly nutritious food.

Uniform

As we approach the end of the term at last, please check that all aspects of your child's uniform are present and correct. Remember, Good Shepherd children arrive at and leave school, in full uniform. The only exception is that junior children may wear their sports shoes to school on fitness mornings, so long as they bring school shoes to change back into. School shoes, including soles, are black, without coloured laces or markings. Canvas shoes are not recommended in winter as feet can get wet and cold. Shoes are generally not allowed in classrooms but slippers are encouraged during winter. Children change into sports clothes at school to play on the field in winter. Hair is 'bling free' with long hair tied back and off the face - this also complies with health and safety. Hair should be a natural colour with no extreme hairstyles please. Studs only, are permitted as earrings.

And why all the fuss about school uniforms? Our students are very proud to attend Good Shepherd School and we are very proud to have them here. Correct school uniform not only looks great, it also proves the point!

This week we would like to direct you once again to the <u>Netsafe</u> website. Netsafe has put 7 tips together to help parents and whānau talk to their young people about online safety. They are designed to enhance your digital parenting knowledge and have been developed with parents in mind.

School Organisation for Terms 3 and 4

Good Shepherd School has had an increase in the number of new entrants this year and we are lucky enough to have the classroom space to accommodate these increased numbers.

From the beginning of term 3, the current Room 2 class, students and teachers, will move to Room 9. New entrants will then be able to continue to start their schooling at Good Shepherd in the Room 1 and 2 area.

The Golden Rules for everyone at Alert Level 1

- If you're sick, stay home. Don't go to school. Don't socialise.
- 2. If you have cold or flu symptoms call your doctor or Healthline and make sure you get tested.
- 3. Wash your hands. Wash your hands. Wash your hands.
- 4. Sneeze and cough into your elbow, and regularly disinfect shared surfaces.
- 5. If you are told by health authorities to self-isolate you must do so immediately.
- If you're concerned about your wellbeing, or have underlying health conditions, work with your GP to understand how best to stay healthy.
- 7. Schools should help people keep track of their movements by displaying the Ministry of Health QR Code for contact tracing. If you have the NZ COVID Tracer app we have a QR code for GSS at the front door of the office. It is advised that you use this if you come on site.
- 8. Stay vigilant. There is still a global pandemic going on. People and schools should be prepared to act fast to step up Alert Levels if we have to.
- People will have had different experiences over the last couple of months. Whatever you're feeling - it's okay. Be kind to others. Be kind to yourself.

Message to Families From Auckland Regional Dental Service



Children's Community Dental Service (Auckland Regional Dental Service) during COVID-19 Alert Level 1:

Kia ora.

Some of our dental clinics will be open during Alert Level 1. We will be offering appointments to children with the most urgent dental care needs. Our staff will be in contact with the parents/caregivers of these children to book appointments.

We will contact parents/caregivers of children who are due for their routine appointments in due course.

We are unable to put a timeframe on this at present, which means there may be delays in routine appointments.

If your child is in pain, or if you have any immediate concerns about their teeth, please phone 0800 TALK TEETH to speak to one of our therapists. The therapist may offer an appointment for your child if required.

We kindly ask that you do not present to the clinics if you don't have an appointment booked. This is because we need to ask all parents/caregivers and patients COVID-19 questions over the phone before booking an appointment. This is to protect our staff and other patients in the clinic.
