Thank you to all in our community who filled in the Health Consultation Survey recently. The following themes could be identified from the responses:

- There were far more responses to the first question, What does our school do really well in helping our students to maintain or improve their wellbeing? than any of the other questions
- Many respondents mentioned daily fitness/physical activity/sport as something that GSS does well
- Mental health/wellbeing/growth mindset/resilience was mentioned as something the school did well and also a possible area of continued development.
