Te Whenua, To Tatou Kura, To Tatou Iwi The Land, Our School, Our People

This term all classes have been focused on exploring the history of our school through a project called *Te Whenua, To Tatou Kura, To Tatou Iwi / The Land, Our School, Our People*. The project involves us in exploring our history and telling our story, starting with pre-human, moving through the arrival of tangata whenua, their use of the whenua, the arrival of Pākeha, the arrival of the Catholic Church and the establishment of the school, and the struggles and successes of all these people up to the present day.

In term 2, we will turn our focus to bringing the story of Good Shepherd School alive for our students and community through a combination of drama, dance, music and visual arts in a school production. We have received support from the Creatives in Schools Ministry of Education initiative, to access an experienced registered teacher, Geoffrey Clendon, who specialises in the teaching of all aspects of drama and storytelling. We are also hoping to use the expertise and strengths within our community our students, teachers, staff and whānau, utilising individual and collective gifts and talents in bringing together the production at the end of term 2.
