Mitey School Wide Approach

This year and into the future, Good Shepherd School is engaging in the Mitey school-wide approach to 'building the mightiest kids in the world'. Designed for NZ children through the Sir John Kirwin Foundation, Mitey supports schools to deliver an evidence based approach to mental health education for Years 1-8. The Mitey journey brings together teachers, staff and communities around one common goal – mentally thriving children. Sport

Unfortunately the GSS Y3-6 Swimming Carnival will not be going ahead this year due to current restrictions put in place under Red setting. This is in regards to the number of people who can be in the facility at one time.

Westwave settings for Red level:

Gathering limits (100 people) doesn't apply to schools when on school grounds, **but still applies in our center.** Therefore we need to abide by the gathering and/or public facility restrictions.

So unfortunately under the RED level of the CPF- we have a maximum capacity for events of no more than **100 people**.

At this stage we don't know how long we will stay in Red level, so it's very difficult to plan ahead for sporting events. Sporting event postponements and cancellations will be updated in the newsletter regularly.

If events can't happen when planned, they will have to be canceled, as our sporting calendar is very full throughout the year.

All Eden/Albert zones events will not be going ahead under the Red level this term, including swimming, cricket and touch.

We are lucky to be able to continue with our swimming programme in our school pool this term.

COVID-19 Update

As you will be aware, we have now moved into Phase 2 of the Red light setting of the COVID-19 Protection Framework. This move reduces the amount of time Close Contacts need to isolate from 10 days to 7 days, with a negative Day 5 test needed to return to school or work. Those who test positive for COVID-19 will need to isolate for 10 days. The whole country is expecting more cases and Good Shepherd School is no exception. We have plans and procedures in place to communicate quickly if we do have a case and we have rigorous preventative measures in place at the school.

How you can help:

- Please let us know immediately if your child has been identified as a positive case of COVID-19. The school will then work very quickly to identify Close Contacts and let whānau know
- Please ensure your child has an effective mask and knows how to wear it effectively
- Continue to remind your child to practise the preventative measures of good hygiene, physical distancing and mask wearing

We support a mask wearing culture across our school. All children in Year 4 and above are required to wear a mask when indoors. We encourage Year 1 to 3 to wear them too. We have found that all children in the past have managed this well with support from our staff and their whanau. If your child is anxious about wearing a mask please reassure them that they are doing this to help others and that from the scientists we know it works.
