Unfortunately the GSS Y3-6 Swimming Carnival will not be going ahead this year due to current restrictions put in place under Red setting. This is in regards to the number of people who can be in the facility at one time.

Westwave settings for Red level:

Gathering limits (100 people) doesn't apply to schools when on school grounds, **but still applies in our center.** Therefore we need to abide by the gathering and/or public facility restrictions.

So unfortunately under the RED level of the CPF- we have a maximum capacity for events of no more than **100 people**.

At this stage we don't know how long we will stay in Red level, so it's very difficult to plan ahead for sporting events. Sporting event postponements and cancellations will be updated in the newsletter regularly.

If events can't happen when planned, they will have to be canceled, as our sporting calendar is very full throughout the year.

All Eden/Albert zones events will not be going ahead under the Red level this term, including swimming, cricket and touch.

We are lucky to be able to continue with our swimming programme in our school pool this term.

COVID-19 Update

Today we have had the announcement that we will be moving into **Phase 3** of the Red light setting of the COVID-19 Protection Framework from 11.59pm tonight. We have yet to learn all the details and implications for school from this change but the two key points seem to be:

- Only positive cases and their household contacts will be required to isolate
- Rapid Antigen Testing will become the accepted form of testing

Please continue to help us by

- Letting us know **immediately** if your child or someone in your household has been identified as a positive case of COVID-19.
- Ensuring that your child has an effective mask and knows how to wear it effectively.
- Continuing to remind your child to practise the preventative measures of good hygiene, physical distancing and mask wearing.

As we work through the next few weeks we will continue to put in place those mitigating measures of keeping in our class 'bubbles', staggering start/finish times and ensuring well-ventilated work spaces.

Finally, a reminder again that we are here to help. Please don't hesitate to get in touch if you have any questions or concerns about your children's learning or if there is anything we can do to support your whānau.

Mask Wearing

We support a mask wearing culture across our school. All children in Year 4 and above are required to wear a mask when indoors. We encourage Year 1 to 3 to wear them too. We have found that all children in the past have managed this well with support from our staff and their whānau. If your child is anxious about wearing a mask please reassure them that they are doing this to help others and that from the scientists we know it works. We understand that some children just can't wear a mask and we will support them with this decision making. Our school also has masks available if children forget theirs. Extension to COVID-19 hardship assistance for whānau

The Government has extended the increased income limits for hardship assistance until Thursday 30 June.

This means more casual or part-time workers, or people who aren't already getting financial support, will continue to be eligible for help with their immediate or emergency costs. This is especially important for those who need direct help as part of the COVID-19 welfare response.
