

Greetings to you all!

I have really enjoyed talking to children about their speeches over the last few weeks. I particularly like hearing about the interesting topics they have decided to research and present – it is another way of getting to know more about them and their interests. The process of writing and presenting a speech to an audience brings wonderful opportunities to develop further the five **key competencies** that drive our New Zealand curriculum. Students have to research and make sense of information (*Thinking*), make choices about language and consider their audience (*Using language, symbols and texts*), set goals around completion and make a plan to reach their goals (*Managing self*), actively listen and give feedback to others (*Relating to others*), and develop confidence to participate in new contexts (*Participating and contributing*). Congratulations to every child for making the most of this learning opportunity. We look forward to hearing the finalists at each year level present their speeches next Wednesday 17 August.

We have had a busy week with our Education Review Office visitors in the school, talking to children, staff and parents about what it is like to be a learner at Good Shepherd School. Thank you to those who were able to be at the powhiri to welcome the reviewers on Monday (I hope you enjoy Erylle's description of the powhiri later in the newsletter). We constantly look at what we are doing to see if we could better support children's learning at Good Shepherd and it is very valuable to see our school through different eyes. Initial feedback is very positive and the board expects the draft report out in a few weeks.
