#### Sport

At this stage we don't know how long we will stay in Red level, so it's very difficult to plan ahead for sporting events. Sporting event postponements and cancellations will be updated in the newsletter regularly.

If events can't happen when planned, they will have to be canceled, as our sporting calendar is very full throughout the year.

All Eden/Albert zones events will not be going ahead under the Red level this term, including swimming, cricket and touch.

We are lucky to be able to continue with our swimming programme in our school pool this term.

#### Information for Whānau Learning Well: Literacy

You may be aware of the recent attention in the media around apparently declining literacy levels among New Zealand children. At GSS we are fortunate to operate well above the national norm in both literacy and numeracy. However we certainly don't take this for granted. Our recent PAT reading assessment has shown a steeper decline than we would usually expect to show up in the term after the long summer break. There is no doubt that all the learning disruptions we have endured have taken a toll on our children's learning. We are determined to rectify this and in order to do so, we need to work in partnership with whānau.

Please ensure that your child reads at home **every single night** no matter how old they are. Ideally a mix of fiction and non-fiction in areas of interest. Talk to them constantly about their reading and their understanding. Next term you may find that your senior school child takes a more formal approach to their reading homework. We also intend to send home extra reading material during the school holidays. Please make time for this important activity.

#### COVID-19 Update

We have had nearly one hundred percent attendance over the last week so it appears that our community may be over the worst of this phase of the COVID-19 pandemic. But with winter approaching, there is potential for more pressure on the health system, not just from COVID-19, but from the flu and other diseases such as RSV and measles. We encourage you to get your boosters, to get flu vaccinations and to make sure childhood immunisations such as MMR are up to date.

In our school we are keeping the additional layers of protection in place to help prevent or reduce the risk of onward spread.

Mask wearing for our students Year 4 and above and for adults remains in place in indoor spaces and we are getting lots of fresh air during the day. We also continue to focus on basic hygiene such as washing hands regularly, covering any coughs and sneezes, and cleaning surfaces regularly.
