# **Learning Well: Literacy**

You may be aware of the recent attention in the media around apparently declining literacy levels among New Zealand children. At GSS we are fortunate to operate well above the national norm in both literacy and numeracy. However we certainly don't take this for granted. Our recent PAT reading assessment has shown a steeper decline than we would usually expect to show up in the term after the long summer break. There is no doubt that all the learning disruptions we have endured have taken a toll on our children's learning. We are

determined to rectify this and in order to do so, we need to work in partnership with whānau.

Please ensure that your child reads at home **every single night** no matter how old they are. Ideally a mix of fiction and non-fiction in areas of interest. Talk to them constantly about their reading and their understanding.

This term you may find that your senior school child takes a more formal approach to their reading homework. Please make time for this important activity.

# **COVID-19 Update**

The first week of school under Orange level has gone well. The children have been very excited to be able to play with their friends from other classes and we are getting high compliance in the wearing of masks and maintaining physical distance when possible.

Thank you for your ongoing support in doing our best to keep everyone safe over the colder weeks ahead by continuing to:

- Send your child to school with a mask
- Keep out of classrooms before school
- Keep your child at home if they are sick
- Vaccinate your child from 5-13 years of age against COVID
- Dress your child warmly for winter

We will continue to monitor the situation carefully and make changes as necessary.

#### **School Uniform**

The children should now be wearing their winter school uniforms. Uniforms are purchased through Elizabeth Michael Uniforms (see notice below) although we do keep a supply of second hand uniforms for purchase at the school. Can we please give special attention to footwear over the winter months? The uniform shoes are black, worn with black knee high socks. As we approach winter and the colder weather, we strongly recommend that

children wear the school uniform jumper and there is also a school jacket available. A warm singlet could also be useful. Please name all uniform items.

Finally, children are asked to bring in a change of clothes if they want to play on the field as it quickly becomes very muddy.


#### **Good Shepherd School App**

Good Shepherd has a new school app called @school. You are able to search and download the app via Google Play or the Apple App store.






An email will be sent to you with your login information over the next week.



When it arrives, make a note of your User ID including forward slashes.

Then **click on the link contained in the email** and it will take you to a page that looks like this.



Shortly after you will be sent another email with your Temporary Password. **Make a note or copy the temporary password**.



Return to the @school Mobile login screen and paste the temporary password.
