From the Principal

Ngā mihi ki a koe me to whānau

Thank you to those parents who were able to come to the PTA meeting last night. In my report to the PTA I focused on three aspects of school life that are very topical. In this Bullying Free NZ Week, we talked about our school's procedures to both prevent and respond to bullying situations. We also discussed student achievement in reading comprehension and mathematics, and we talked about some of the initiatives happening in The Arts learning area this year.

As mentioned in last week's update, Good Shepherd School has very thorough procedures around the prevention and response to bullying situations. These are on our school <u>website</u> for you to view. We are looking forward to seeing lots of pink on Pink Shirt Day tomorrow when the Good Shepherd community shows that we Speak Up, Stand Together, to Stop Bullying.

Over the years, Good Shepherd School has repeatedly performed at a higher level than the national norms in PAT Mathematics and Reading Comprehension assessments, and we have been very eager to know what the impact of the pandemic interruptions have had on this picture.

As we suspected, the lockdown periods have had a detrimental effect on student achievement in reading comprehension and mathematics, although our students continue to perform above the national average. We are working urgently as a team to put in place targeted support for individuals and groups of students to recoup some of these losses in achievement. Our school website also has a great section called <u>Helping at Home</u>.

We will include some more information about how The Arts curriculum is delivered at Good Shepherd in the next newsletter. Meanwhile, don't forget that coming along to PTA meetings is a great way to get to know your school, your teachers and other parents.

Learning Well: Literacy

Our completed PAT data analysis confirmed that we are performing well above the national norm in



reading (remembering that this 'norm' was established prior to COVID disruptions). However, we also confirmed that over the last six months many more GSS children than usual either stagnated or lost ground in their reading comprehension. Thank you to those whānau who made reading a priority throughout the Easter holidays. Please continue to encourage lots of reading after school and during weekends, talk to your tamariki about what they are reading, read to them, and let them see you read as well. See your classroom teacher if your child needs help choosing suitable books.

COVID-19 Update

The first two weeks of school under Orange level have gone well. The children have been very excited to be able to play with their friends from other classes and we are getting high compliance in the wearing of masks and maintaining physical distance when possible.

Bullying Free NZ Week: Good Shepherd School Bullying Prevention and Response Procedures

Next week is Bullying Free NZ Week. The prevention of bullying in schools and how schools

respond to reported cases of bullying are areas that are of interest and concern to everybody in our country. We are fortunate to have 'The Good Shepherd Way', with the emphasis on the school values of **respect**, **care** and **honesty**, to help us make our school a respectful and inclusive environment, but it is important that we continue to work together to ensure that our school is a model of best practice in bullying prevention and response. This is a shared responsibility where students, staff, parents, whānau and other members of the community all work towards the same goal. The first step is to ensure we have a shared understanding of what 'bullying' is, and the definition we have shared with our community in the past is:

Bullying behaviour is not an individual action. Our school community agrees that:

- Bullying is deliberate
- Bullying involves a power imbalance
- Bullying has an element of repetition
- Bullying is harmful.

Bullying behaviours can be physical, verbal, or social, and can take place in the physical world or digitally.

Bullying is not an individual action. It involves up to three parties: initiators (those doing the bullying), targets (those being bullied) and often bystanders (those who witness the bullying).

Our response procedures are very clear and are available on our school website. As always, we are open to feedback on this definition, or any other part of the procedures, from anyone in our community.

School Uniform

The children should now be wearing their winter school uniforms. Uniforms are purchased through Elizabeth Michael Uniforms (see notice below) although we do keep a supply of second hand uniforms for purchase at the school. Can we please give special attention to footwear over the winter months? The uniform shoes are black, worn with black knee high socks. As we approach winter and the colder weather, we strongly recommend that children wear the school uniform jumper and there is also a school jacket available. A warm singlet could also be useful. Please name all uniform items.

Finally, children are asked to bring in a change of clothes if they want to play on the field as it quickly becomes very muddy.
