LIEUTENANT COMMANDER GEORGE HAHN'S VISIT

Last week we had Lieutenant Commander George Hahn (AKA Mrs Hahn's son) come into our school. He has been in the NZ Air Force for 12 years. He has recently been flying a helicopter named Sea Sprite which goes 240.76 kilometers per hour. Before he was in the NZ Air Force he was in the Royal NZ Navy and trained in Palmerston North for 2 years.

WHAT I LEARNT:

He taught us about how planes and helicopters fly around and manoeuvre. I learnt a lot, the big propeller on a helicopter is called a rotor and a bird strike is when a bird attacks the plane or helicopter it is usually a plane. A plane has to go fast the entire time it's flying and can't stop until it lands on the runway. For the helicopter to work you need wind to pass the rotor on top of it.

In conclusion I learnt a large number of things from Lieutenant Commander George Hahn in his visit and it was a valuable learning experience.

Anzac Day 2022

Anzac Day occurs during the school holidays again this year and we encourage whānau to attend a service if they are able to. This year our Cultural Leaders raised an Anzac flag on our flagpole to commemorate this important day for our nation.




LEST WE FORGET
