Beat the Bugs this Winter

There has been lots of information about the continued risk of rising COVID-19 cases as we head into winter. At Good Shepherd School we continue to have cases of students and teachers testing positive, although these are substantially down on the number of cases in term 1.

While we have been enjoying having whānau back in school grounds, we really appreciate your cooperation in not spending too much time in classrooms and in continuing to wear masks while visiting the school. We have also had high compliance with our request for students, especially those in Years 4-6, to wear masks while indoors.

Our other mitigation measures include:

- good cough and sneeze etiquette
- regular cleaning
- staying away if unwell
- good ventilation in all indoor areas

We are also aware of the dangers of the spread of measles, a highly infectious virus that spreads faster than COVID-19 in people who aren't immune to it. The best protection against measles is vaccination with two doses of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine. Please check with your doctor if you are unsure about your own or your children's vaccination status.

Good Shepherd OSCA

Our before and after school care programme is an important service to our school community and every care is taken to guard children's safety and wellbeing while they are at OSCA. A couple of extra reminders:

Good Shepherd School Uniform

The children should now be wearing their winter school uniforms. Uniforms are purchased through Elizabeth Michael Uniforms (see notice below) although we do keep a supply of second hand uniforms for purchase at the school. Can we please give special attention to footwear over the winter months? The uniform shoes are black, worn with black knee high socks. As we approach winter and

the colder weather, we strongly recommend that children wear the school uniform jumper and there is also a school jacket available. A warm singlet could also be useful. Please name all uniform items.

Finally, children are asked to bring in a change of clothes if they want to play on the field as it quickly becomes very muddy.



Sushi and Pie days

Sushi is now available to order for lunch on Fridays. Orders are taken online only via Kindo. If you do not have a Kindo account, it is quick and easy to set one up by clicking Join Up. Please check your child's classroom number. Sushi orders close at 8.45am on Friday mornings. Remember if your child orders Teriyaki chicken on rice, please send them to school with a fork in their lunchbox. You can order in advance for multiple weeks and you can also cancel your order through your account before 8.45 on a Friday morning.

The children enjoyed their Pie Day earlier this month with pies supplied by our local bakery Dough Boys. There will be a second Pie Day on Tuesday 5th July. As Dough Boys are experiencing some staff shortages at the moment, they require order numbers one week in advance. Therefore, orders for Pie Day will close at 12 noon on Tuesday, 28th June.

As next Friday, 24th June is Matariki holiday, sushi will be available to order on Thursday 23rd June. If you have ordered sushi for Friday 24th June, your

account has been credited and you need to go back and re order if you would like your child to have sushi on Thursday 23rd June.

Road Safety on Telford Ave

A reminder to all parents that drop their children off in cars, please limit your speed AT ALL times. In a school zone: rules exist to keep children, parents and carers safe and to minimise speed and traffic jams around school. We have been getting alarming reports about fast cars entering Telford Ave specifically between the times of 7:30am-9am and 3pm-6pm. Many children are in the OSCA before and after school care, and we understand parents and caregivers time commitments but the safety of all takes higher precedence over those pressures.
