From the Principal

Tēnā koutou e hoa mā,

One of the tamariki asked me yesterday how it feels to be a principal. I replied that I feel like I'm pretending to be a grown up! However, I also feel a sense of privilege and responsibility in being trusted to steer the Good Shepherd waka this term, along with my friend and colleague Heather McLeod. We all wish Jane a successful and refreshing sabbatical. We know that tamariki, kaiako and whānau will work together to ensure that things run smoothly and happily until our principal, who we value a little more each day, returns in nine weeks and one day - not that anyone's counting....

In the Herald a couple of days ago I read a concerning article about plummeting attendance rates in schools. Along with Omicron and the flu, it seems there is an emerging issue around chronic absenteeism, with students habitually missing days of school.

Good Shepherd has a comparatively strong attendance rate. However the constant disruptions of the past two years have taken their toll and for some of us, tamariki included, motivation has been affected. We already know that our children have lost some academic ground, and we are working hard to get them back on track.

Please think very carefully before you allow your child to miss school for any non-medical reason.

Research shows that motivation usually follows action rather than the reverse. Remind your child that once they get immersed in the mahi (work) the excitement of learning will soon follow. Talk to them about making school an inviting place for all Good Shepherd whānau, not just close friends, and ask them to look out for each other in the classroom and the playground. Every single learning day is precious!

We look forward to welcoming you into the school next week to discuss your child's progress and their learning goals.

Information for Whānau School Board Elections - We Need You!



Nominations are open for the election of 5 parent representatives to the school board. All eligible voters will receive a nomination form. Use this form to nominate yourself or someone in your community. You will also receive a nomination cover letter calling for nominations. Information on who is not eligible to be a board member is provided with the nomination form. If you need more nomination forms, contact the school office. Nominations close at noon on Wednesday 3rd August 2022. You may provide a signed candidate statement and photograph with your nomination. The electoral roll is held at the school and can be viewed during normal school hours. As nominations are received, there will be a list of candidates' names kept at the school up until election day, which you can view. Election voting closes at 4pm on Wednesday 7th September 2022.

Health Updates

In their recent update, the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health strongly recommend that all schools



require mask wearing in all indoor settings for students in Years 4 and above. We also encourage our younger children to wear them when possible.

Adult-sized masks can generally be adjusted to fit children by tying knots in the ear loops. Unite Against COVID-19 shows how to do this:

Please make sure that tamariki come to school ready to wear masks. Students should ideally bring masks from home but please ensure that it is clean and named, even if it is paper.

Please also remind students to cough and sneeze into their elbow, whether or not they are masked, as we are noticing some of the tamariki have forgotten about this good habit recently.

Good Shepherd School Uniform

Please ensure that your child is wearing their correct school uniform:

Winter Uniform: Students wear winter uniform in Terms 2 & 3. This includes black knee high socks and black shoes.

Sports Uniform: Compulsory for Years 4, 5 and 6. Jewellery, nail polish, makeup, hair

A watch and ear studs are the only jewellery permitted with the school uniform. Nail polish is not permitted on either fingers or toes. Makeup may not

be worn. Long hair must be tied back. Hair accessories must be either navy blue or black. Finally, we have a good selection of second hand uniforms available at minimal cost from our school office.
