Healthy Tamariki

Mask wearing is no longer required for our tamariki. However, should you or your tamariki feel more comfortable continuing to wear a mask this is perfectly fine. At this time of year it can be difficult to distinguish between allergies and a cold, so you might also consider asking your child to wear a mask if they have a runny nose for example.


Ākonga who are household contacts, but test negative and do not have COVID-19 symptoms, can continue to attend school now, as long as they complete a negative RAT test each day, for five days. School is the best place for them to be. Information on how to get RAT kits can be found <u>here.</u>

All the other recommended public health measures will stay in place as we know they reduce the spread of infectious illnesses including COVID-19. These include ensuring our indoor spaces are well-ventilated, maintaining good hand hygiene, encouraging everyone to cough or sneeze into elbows and, most importantly, staying home and getting tested if they have COVID-19 symptoms.
