Health Consultation



Good Shepherd OSCA

Our before and after school care programme is an important service to our school community and every care is taken to guard children's safety and wellbeing while they are at OSCA. It is very important that we are notified if there is a change in the nominated person picking up your child. This means that children will not be released to anyone other than the person or people nominated on our records unless contact has been made by that person to advise a change. A couple of extra reminders:

- An adult toilet is available in the OSCA area if you need it - please do not use the children's toilets

Good Shepherd School Summer Uniform

Students are expected to be in full summer uniform starting Term 4, Monday October 17 and through to the end of Term 1, 2023.

Summer Uniform: Students wear summer uniforms in Terms 4 & 1. This includes black sandals and a wide-brim school hat.

Sports Uniform: Compulsory for Years 4, 5 and 6. Jewellery, nail polish, makeup, hair

A watch and ear studs are the only jewellery permitted with the school uniform. Nail polish is not permitted on either fingers or toes. Makeup may not

be worn. Long hair must be tied back. Hair accessories must be either navy blue or black. Remember, we have a good selection of second hand uniforms available at minimal cost from our school office.
