From the principal....

Greetings to you all!

This week we celebrate Tongan Language Week/ Uike Kātoanga'i 'o e Lea Faka-Tonga and the theme for 2016 is 'Fakakoloa 'a Aotearoa 'aki 'a e Loto'i Tonga' (Enriching Aotearoa with the Tongan Spirit). We are fortunate to have a number of Tongan families as a part of our school community and this week they become our 'experts' as we learn some basic lea faka-Tonga. *Cultural diversity* and *inclusion* are two of the principles that underpin our New Zealand Curriculum and celebrating the customs and languages of the different groups that make up our community helps our children to explore the values of diversity, community and respect, supports them in the learning languages area and develops the key competencies, especially *using language, symbols, and texts*, and *relating to others*.

As you will be aware, Pope Francis has declared the year between the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on 8 December 2015, and the Feast of Christ the King on 20 November 2016, as a Holy Year of Mercy. The Pope urges us to heed 'the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor', and has established a Season of Prayer for Creation 1 September – 4 October. In his encyclical on the environment and human ecology, Laudato Si (2015) he reminds us:

All Creatures are connected, each must be cherished with LOVE and RESPECT, for all of us as LIVING Creatures are dependent on one another

The Year of Mercy fits beautifully with our very own Good Shepherd charism, built on the Josephite tradition of service to the poor and the values of care, respect and honesty.
