#### **An ANZAC** connection to Good Shepherd

#### PRIVATE JOHN MATTHEW O'BRIEN R.I.P.

John O'Brien received his primary education at the Convent of the Good Shepherd and the Marist

Brothers School, Vermont Street and attended Sacred College during 1937 and 1938. He was always of a pleasant and obliging disposition and very popular with his school mates. While at SHC he took a prominent part in Rugby swimming and Cricket.

Before entering the Army at the age of eighteen, John was an apprentice plasterer.

He spent some time in the Air Force in New Zealand before being transferred back to the Army and leaving for the Middle East with the 15th Reinforcements.



From the Middle East he was sent to Japan with the New

Zealand Occupation Forces. John died tragically on 9 August 1946.

Education Review Office (ERO)


Good Shepherd School, like all schools in Aotearoa New Zealand, is externally reviewed by ERO. Te Ara Huarau is the evaluation approach that ERO is using in our school. This is a developmental approach to

evaluation where ERO and our school work together over time rather than one off reviews that happened previously. Te Ara Huarau is used in most English-medium state and state-integrated schools.

ERO maintains a regular review programme to evaluate and report on the education and care of young people in schools. Our school worked alongside ERO to write our Profile Report. This type of report will only happen once as part of our initial engagement with Te Ara Huarau. The profile report reflects our strategic goals and a shared evaluation focus on one or more areas that are important to us as we work together to improve outcomes for all our learners. ERO, like us, has a strong focus on equity and excellence. Future reporting will show our progress and achievement towards meeting the goals we have set. Public reports like the Profile Report are published on ERO's website.

#### Attendance Dues and Donations 2023

Attendance Dues are a compulsory payment approved by the Minister of Education under the terms of the Education and Training Act 2020. They are a condition of enrolment at Good Shepherd School, as they are in all Catholic schools in Aotearoa New Zealand. Attendance Dues are collected by Good Shepherd School on behalf of the school's Proprietor, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Auckland. Thank you to all of our families that have made payments already and to our families who have made per term, per week and per fortnight arrangements.

Good Shepherd School also asks for **donations** from whānau. We rely on these donations to provide the extra learning opportunities, such as the *Opera in Schools* performance in week 5, and the exceptional resources available to our students, such as one-to-one devices in our classrooms. These donations include *Trips and Activities* and,

where relevant, camp donations so that we can offer our students a range of rich education outside the classroom experiences. As a small school, we very much appreciate these contributions to our limited budget.

This is just a reminder that children are under the care of their parents or caregivers after 3pm, unless they have been booked into our Out

7.30am and 8.30am for those children whose parents need to get away to work early. Children are not closely supervised in the playground before 8.30am.


