

From the Principal

Yesterday I visited three Catholic schools around Auckland with a group of teachers and parents from Good Shepherd. We were interested to see how other schools are using their resources to create learning spaces more suited to 21st century learners, who are described in our New Zealand Curriculum's vision as young people:

- who will be creative, energetic, and enterprising;
- who will seize the opportunities offered by new knowledge and technologies to secure a sustainable social, cultural, economic, and environmental future for our country;
- who will be confident, connected, actively involved, and lifelong learners.

The physical environment of schools is changing to accommodate the complex demands of this 21st century education. New schools, and new buildings for existing schools, reflect this thinking and provide opportunities for students to engage in independent learning, small group or large group work, and for teachers to work co-operatively across spaces and learning areas. Students are able to access appropriate technology for anytime, anywhere learning. Good Shepherd, like many schools, is exploring ways we can modify our existing buildings to provide the flexibility demanded from new teaching methods. We are also looking at how furniture can encourage motivation and engagement in learning by providing comfort and choice to students. Our rooms 3 and 4 provide an ideal opportunity for this because of the removable wall between the classes, and this year Mrs McLeod and Miss Briggs have been developing a more flexible learning space to provide the best opportunities for their students to learn. Some of the proceeds from the PTA fair last year will be allocated to providing suitable furnishings that will encourage a collaborative, cooperative and self-motivated learning environment. All changes at Good Shepherd School will be monitored closely to ensure the best outcomes for our children.

It was interesting yesterday to see where different schools are in this development and to hear their stories. If you have any questions or would like to discuss innovative learning environments please do not hesitate to drop by my office. It is an exciting time to be involved in education – whether as a teacher, a parent or a learner.

Firewise in R2


This term Sheridan has learnt how to be 'Firewise.' We now know what to do if we find matches or lighters and we know what to do if there is a fire at home. One of the most important messages for us is...

"Don't play with matches or lighters."

We learnt that everyone needs smoke alarms at home and families need to plan in advance for a safe meeting place in case there is a fire. If the smoke alarm goes off we have to...

"Get Down, Get Low, Get Out Fast."

Room 2 made a mural to show what to do if we hear a smoke alarm. When the Fire Fighters from the Balmoral Fire Station visited us, they got us to practice crawling under a smoke screen. They told us to be careful on *Guy Fawkes* night, as it is their busiest night of the year.

If there was a fire I would get down and crawl out fast and then go to my safe meeting place and call 111. Don't play with matches because they could make your home catch on fire and that is dangerous. If you see matches, give them to an adult, don't play with them.

Concerns and complaints

At Good Shepherd School we are committed to an 'open door' environment. We know that if a problem does occur, early intervention often reaps the best results, so take your concern to the appropriate person at the earliest possible convenient time. It is always better to talk directly to the teacher rather than let a problem grow through not addressing it.

CONCERNS AND COMPLAINTS FLOWCHART

If you are worried by something in your child's classroom here is what to do:
