#### In & Around School

#### Winter Uniform in Term 2 & Term 3

From Monday, 28 April until Friday, 19 September, all students are required to wear their full winter school uniform. This includes, black socks & black winter school shoes. No hats needed.

As the colder months approach, please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the season in school approved uniform items only. While it may be tempting to send children in bright or non-uniform winter jackets and coats, we kindly ask that these are avoided to maintain consistency across the school.

All classrooms are heated and kept warm, so there is no need for heavy outerwear indoors.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping us maintain our school's uniform standards.

#### **Change of Clothes - Field**

In term 2 children will need to be wearing a change of clothes to play on the field at break times. This will begin on the first day of term 2.

#### **Cross Country Training**

In week 2 of term 2 the whole school will begin training for the cross country. Children will need to be wearing appropriate footwear for running. They can bring in their running shoes each day for training and a change of clothes (change of clothes is optional). If your child can't tie their shoelaces yet, please provide a pair of running shoes that have velcro on them. We will be training Monday to Thursday every week until the school cross country in week 7.



#### **NZ** Curriculum refresh and school reports

You may be aware that we have begun implementing the refreshed New Zealand Curriculum. This updated curriculum is designed to equip our tamariki with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary for their future success.

While these changes are being introduced in classrooms, our reporting documents will not be updated to reflect the new curriculum outcomes until

next year. For the remainder of this year, student progress will continue to be reported using our current anniversary reports for year 0-2 students, and mid and end of year reports for students in year 3-6. We will be holding a community consultation in the near future. This will provide an opportunity for parents, caregivers, and whānau to learn more about the curriculum changes and ask any questions you may have. Further details regarding the date and time will be shared shortly.

## Hōtoke (Winter) is definitely upon us! Winter Wellness Reminder

As we head into the winter season, it's common for colds and other bugs to make their rounds. To help keep our school community healthy, please remind your children about the importance of:
