From the principal.... Tēnā koutou katoa

Tena koutou katoa

Education is never far from the news and has been getting its fair share of coverage over the last few weeks. Two areas that we are hearing a lot about are the 'scrapping of National Standards' and the use of physical restraint in schools. I thought it might be useful to comment briefly on those two areas to help clear up any misconceptions that can arise from media reporting.

Measuring students' progress and achievement against National Standards in Reading, Writing and Mathematics, and reporting to parents in relation to these standards, has been a requirement in New Zealand schools since 2010. Teachers make Overall Teacher Judgements, considering evidence from multiple sources including standardized tests and students' workbooks, when making these judgements. Schools are required to send in their results every year and these are published on the Ministry of Education website. Our new government has announced that national standards will go, although the process of changing legislation will take time. Meanwhile, schools will continue to use the National Standards and report against these, both to parents and the Ministry of Education. Good Shepherd School uses a range of assessment processes to monitor and evaluate students' progress and uses the information gathered for a number of different purposes, the most important one being to plan effective teaching and learning programmes.

Recent legislation has provided explicit guidelines about the conditions under which physical restraint in schools might be used in schools and introduced a reporting process should such action be taken. Again, there has been much comment on this in the media recently. Good Shepherd School has developed procedures in line with this legislation. We will, however, continue to build a culture of positive behavior management focused on our *Good Shepherd Way* with the values of Care, Respect and Honesty at its heart. If you would like to discuss either of these very topical subjects with me, I am very happy to do so.

This Sunday marks the beginning of Advent, the season of the Church year during which we prepare for the birth of Jesus. We are all looking forward to sharing with you the special occasions, both in school and parish, that this special time brings.

Albert/Eden Schools Cultural Festival 2017


