

The Good Shepherd School App

If you have the downloaded the app from last year and your child has changed classes, you will need to change the class you want to receive notifications from. Go to the drop down menu icon, located in the top left corner, select Alert Subscriptions, Classrooms, and then select the classroom/s.

Some reminders for the beginning of the year:

Stationery

Thank you for making such an effort to pay for your child's stationery. It is very important that we make maximum use of every school day for learning and having the correct tools helps to provide your child with a positive start to the school year.

Uniform

It was great to see the children turn up this week looking neat in their uniforms. We continually reinforce the importance of taking care and pride in our school and part of this is the school uniform. *Please name all clothing.*

School uniforms can be purchased on **Thursday mornings** between 8.30am and 9.00am. Please note, the school does not have eftpos or credit card facilities.

We are sun smart!

School sunhats are compulsory for all children as part of our summer uniform. These are available from the school office. Children without school sunhats will be required to play only in shaded areas during break times. We also encourage all children to put on sunblock in the morning and to re-apply this before going out during break times. Sun block is available in all classrooms and teachers will also be re-enforcing this message.

Attendance and Punctuality

We cannot emphasize strongly enough how important it is for children to be at school every day unless they are genuinely too unwell to attend. **EVERY DAY COUNTS.**

Our school day starts at 8.50 a.m. Any one arriving after this is asked to report to the school office. Please aim to have your children at school before 8.45 as this gives them a positive start to the day.

Car Park Safety

The chain into the Telford Avenue car park is put up every day between 8am and 9am and then again from 2.45pm to 3.30pm to keep all cars out of this area. This is to keep our children safe during those busy pick up and drop off times. All children are required to wait on the church steps to be picked up in the afternoon and we appreciate your promptness in doing this. Don't forget we have some excellent Walking School Buses at Good Shepherd so please contact us if you would like some more information on these.

Attendance Dues and Donations

As always at this time of year, there has been a lot in the media recently about the attendance dues and donations schools are asking their parents to pay. Next week you will receive a statement outlining 2018 dues and donations for your child/children at Good Shepherd School. Attendance dues are compulsory and enable the Catholic Diocese of Auckland to provide and maintain the land and buildings in our Catholic school system. The Special Character donation also supports the wider Catholic education system by helping to provide religious education advisers and other personnel.

The other contributions you are asked to pay come directly to the school and enable us to provide the resources and programmes for all children that you have come to expect from Good Shepherd. We ask that, if at all possible, you pay all the contributions outlined in your account. As always, if you have any difficulties at all please do not hesitate to speak to Mrs Hahn.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE DUES SPONSORSHIP SCHEME

The Attendance Dues Sponsorship Scheme - has been created to assist families who may need financial support with the payment of attendance dues, for students attending Catholic schools in Auckland Diocese, both primary and secondary.

The purpose of the sponsorship scheme is to allow parents or caregivers facing financial hardship another option to seek relief where they may be reluctant to approach their school for help.
